### Background

Anne Smith's professional career has spanned over 30 years, including a 6 year internship with Ronald Kolman Architect, which became Kolman & Smith Architects in 1991. In October 2001, the firms of Lominack Associates and Kolman & Smith Architects merged to form Lominack Kolman Smith Architects. The merger brought the expertise of both to form a new firm with diverse and varied experience. Many projects Anne has overseen have involved working with non-profit agencies and coordinating with volunteer boards of directors and building committees.

Anne's work has consisted of both new construction and rehabilitation for a wide variety of project types, including the hospitality industry, commercial office buildings, multi-family residential projects, facilities for non-profit agencies, healthcare offices and labs, retail, and a variety of unique building types. She actively participates in the design and management of projects as well as the overall management of the firm.

Participating as a volunteer with the Georgia State Board of Architects and Interior Designers has led Anne to many leadership and volunteer opportunities. She is actively involved with NCARB committees that affect architects and future architects. NCARB activities have included multiple committees advancing development of the Architectural Registration Exam, creating the IPAL program (Integrated Path to Architectural Licensing), working with the Future Title Task Force, the Broadly Experienced Architect program and currently with the Interiors Task Force. Anne was appointed by the governor and has held positions of leadership on state, regional and national boards in support of advancing our profession and protecting the public. She has advocated and testified to promote responsible regulation in our state (and never misses the AIA Savannah lobby day at the state capitol).

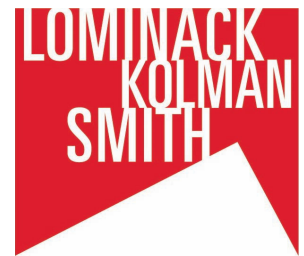
