Coming soon: Final phase of IDP 2.0

What does it mean for you?

In 2009, NCARB announced the most significant overhaul to the Intern Development Program since the program began. What began with the e-EVR, 6 month rule, training hours, new eligibility dates and various other improvements will culminate next month on April 3rd with the implementation of the final phase of IDP 2.0. The e-EVR will go offline at noon EST on the 3rd and go live on the 5th with an all new electronic reporting system, new experience categories and areas, work settings, academic internships and revisions to supervisor requirements.



This phase only impacts those interns in the process of completing IDP as of April 3rd; all of your saved, submitted or approved experience will be rolled over into the new system. If your IDP is complete and your experience has been evaluated

IDP TO IDP 2.0: THE MAP

IDP 2.0 EXPERIENCE CATEGORIES
The current IDP (shades of brown) includes four training categories in which interns must earn experience. Although the IDP 2.0 experience categories (orange to yellow) are similar to those that exist now, they have been derived through the Practice Analysis to align with current architectural practice. For example, the current training category "Design and Construction Documents" is redefined into two experience categories in IDP 2.0: "Pre-Design" and "Design."

IDP 2.0 EXPERIENCE AREAS
Each experience category includes specific experience areas. Just like in the current program, each of the experience areas has core minimum hours required. Through the Practice Analysis, each experience area was weighted to how important it is for the independent practice of architecture. So although the total number of hours required to complete IDP remains 5,600 hours, the distribution of the core minimums is slightly different. All hours earned in the current program will be credited to their related experience areas in IDP 2.0.

New! Associates Roundtable at AIA Florida Convention

This roundtable discussion will be hosted and moderated by JJ Scott, Assoc. AIA and will feature a lecture by 2012 AIA Young Architect Award winner Brad Tomecek, AIA, LEED AP. Brad will discuss opportunities for Associate leadership, tackling the licensure process, and various other topics. The roundtable will take place Saturday morning on July 21, so it will not require a request for a day off to attend. It will also provide an opportunity for discussion among Associates, an opportunity to network, and celebrate the future of our profession. This is the first time an event at the convention has been provided specifically for Associate Members. Make plans to attend!
