Also invited is Florida Senate President Kathleen Passidomo, who will discuss the state of housing in Florida and the impact on the state's growth and economy.

More sessions will include panel discussions covering tips and techniques for successful fee negotiations, the impact of density, diversity, not for profits and philanthropy on affordable housing, and continuing the conversation from

last year's convention will be deans and directors from Florida schools of architecture.

New this year will be an architectural photography workshop with AIA Florida Photographer of the Year recipient Steven Brooke, and representatives from Black Architects in the Making (BAM) leading the marshmallow and toothpick bridge challenge.

The convention would not be complete without traditional events such as the President's Welcome Reception, Drink and Draw, Trade Show, Design Awards, Emerging Professionals Reception, exciting tours, and the fun, yet competitive golf tournament!

# PAUL GOLDBERGER, HON. AIA AUTHOR, JOURNALIST, EDUCATOR

Paul Goldberger is the former architecture critic for The New York Times, where his architecture criticism was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in 1984. He lectures widely around the country about architecture, design, historic preservation and cities. Goldberger has taught at both the Yale School of Architecture and the Graduate School of Journalism at the University of California, Berkeley and currently holds the Joseph Urban Chair at The New School in New York City.

Goldberger is the author of several books, notably "Why Architecture Matters" and "Building Art: The Life and Work of Frank Gehry." Goldberger's book on the process of rebuilding Ground Zero, "UP FROM ZERO: Politics, Architecture, and the Rebuilding of New York," was named one of The New York Times Notable Books for 2004. In addition to the Pulitzer, his writing has received many awards including the National Building Museum's Vincent Scully Prize and the Medal of Honor of the New York Landmarks Preservation Foundation.

Goldberger has served as an advisor to cultural and educational institutions on architect selection and design, to organizations such as the Corcoran Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C. and the New York Public Library, emphasizing his commitment to shaping the architectural landscape.

In his keynote address, Goldberger will delve into how architecture impacts how we live, work, and play within our communities and plays a pivotal role in our collective human experience.

#### RALPH CAMPBELL, CEO, CERTIFIED MASTER COACH, LEARNING OPTIMIZED

Ralph Campbell is a certified master coach and president of Learning Optimized. Campbell's genuine dedication to helping others is rooted in his lifelong commitment to giving back to his community. He has supported and served on the boards of numerous charities, including Camelot Community Care, United Way of Broward County, Nova Southeastern University, Broward Partnership for the Homeless, Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County, Women in Distress, and the National Conference for Community and Justice. Campbell has been recognized as one of the "Most Powerful African Americans" in south Florida and was honored by the Sun Sentinel as a Community Hero and by the Broward County Public School System. A graduate of Dartmouth Tuck School of Business Leadership Program, Leadership Broward XXII and Leadership Florida XXVII, Campbell earned a bachelor's degree in marketing from Morehouse College and began his journey toward a master's degree and Ph.D in the fall of 2022.

Campbell's keynote presentation will explore the four mindset categories, helping you discover leadership abilities that have the power to take you to your fullest potential.

# THE HONORABLE KATHLEEN PASSIDOMO, PRESIDENT, FLORIDA SENATE

Kathleen Passidomo is the President of the Florida Senate. Passidomo formerly served in the Florida House of Representatives from 2010-2016 and has served in the Florida Senate consecutively since her election in 2016. Under her tenure, she has led the development and passage of comprehensive legislation to increase attainable workforce housing, expanded access to Florida's Wildlife Corridor and invested more than \$4 billion to support hurricane recovery and increase storm resiliency in the Sunshine State.

In Passidomo's keynote session, she will discuss the state of housing in Florida and the impact of housing attainability on the growth and economy of the state.

#### PHILLIP G. BERNSTEIN, FAIA, NOMA, LEED AP, ASSOCIATE DEAN AND PROFESSOR

Phillip Bernstein is an architect, technologist, and educator. He is currently an associate dean and adjunct adjunct professor at the Yale University School of Architecture, where he has taught since 1989. He developed the practice curriculum at Yale and has taught the required courses as well as research seminars on the business models and value propositions of the profession. He recently taught a course with Amb. (Ret) Luis C. Debaca on forced labor in the building supply chain. He has been a visiting course lecturer at Harvard, Princeton, Columbia, MIT, Michigan, Cal Berkeley, and Cornell. He writes and

lectures extensively about practice and technology issues, has been published in numerous architectural magazines and newspapers, and has contributed to books and journals about technology, design, and architectural practice.

In Bernstein's keynote, explore the world of Automation, Autonomy and Architecture in the Design and Construction Era of Al.

### LIZ YORK, FAIA SUSTAINABLE DESIGN EXPERT, GSA

Liz York, FAIA joined the Office of Federal High-Performance Green Buildings as a sustainable design expert for the US General Services Administration in 2023. Previously, York served as senior advisor for buildings and facilities policy and innovation and chief sustainability officer for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. York brings innovation to facility policy and operations and implements healthy, resilient, equitable work environments for the federal government. She served as the first chair of the AIA Committee for Climate Action and Design Excellence where she worked to thread the triple bottom line into the actions, tools and communications created for architects. She has received two White House awards for sustainability, been named to the Atlanta Business Chronicle's Sustainability Who's Who and has been recognized by the American Institute of Architects as a Fellow for her work to impact health and well-being by empowering architects to build better environments.


