WHO can be an Associate AIA Member?

- Enrolled in the Architectural Experience Program (AXP) & working towards licensure
- Working under the supervision of a licensed architect
- Faculty member in a university program in architecture

Associate membership is open to those who have a professional degree in architecture, work under the supervision of an architect, are enrolled in AXP, or are a faculty member in a university architecture program.
