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


His experience includes the new Dr. E.J. and Margaret O'Brien Hall at Marquette University; the Pacific Center Campus Amenities Building in San Diego, CA; the East End Transformation at Washington University in St Louis; the Fine Arts + Design Studios and the Career and Technical Education Center projects, both at Johnson County Community College; and the creation of a high performance, conceptual framework for the redevelopment of the Edmonton City Centre Airport, in collaboration with Snøhetta.

James' leadership and approach to human-purposed integrated design has resulted in quantifiable positive outcomes for his clients, from energy and water efficiency to improved occupant health and increased user productivity. His work has been recognized for design excellence and sustainable stewardship from national entities like the American Institute of Architects, Architectural Record, and the US Green Building Council. These honors include the AIA Regional and Urban Design Award (Washington University in St. Louis East End Transformation) and The Chicago Athenaeum: Museum of Architecture & Design & The European Centre for Architecture Art American Architecture Award (Pacific Center Campus Development).

James has presented both regionally and nationally at conferences for organizations including the American Institute of Architects (AIA) and the Society for College and University Planning (SCUP) and has served as an adjunct professor and co-teacher for a comprehensive design studio at Kansas State University. He has also frequently served as a guest design critic for the University of Kansas, Kansas State University, the Kansas City Art Institute, and the Kansas City Design Center.

Hip-Hop. Architecture. Urbanism: The Shaping of a Cultural Practice

Sekou Cooke is an architect, urban designer, researcher, and curator. Born in Jamaica and based in Charlotte, North Carolina, he is the Director of the Master of Urban Design program at UNC Charlotte, the 2021/2022 Nasir Jones HipHop Fellow at the Hutchins Center for African & African American Research at Harvard University, and a founding member of the Black Reconstruction Collective.

Founded in 2008, sekou cooke STUDIO has completed design commissions for masterplans, multi-unit residential developments, residential and commercial buildings, interior renovations, speculative developments, and tenant improvements across the United States and internationally.

Key recent projects include the forthcoming Syracuse Hip-Hop Headquarters, designs for Los Angeles Department of Building and Safety's Standard Plan ADU Program, and Grids + Griots, an architectural intervention commissioned for the 2021 Chicago Architecture Biennial.

Cooke's research practice centers on the emergent field of Hip-Hop Architecture, a theoretical movement reflecting the core tenets of hip-hop culture with the power to create meaningful impact on the built environment and give voice to the marginalized and underrepresented within design practice.

This work has been explored through his writings, exhibitions, lectures, and symposia. It is the subject of his monograph Hip-Hop Architecture, published in April 2021, and the 2018 exhibition, Close to the Edge: The Birth of Hip-Hop Architecture, first mounted in 2018 at the AIA Center for Architecture in New York. This exhibition has travelled to several venues across the US. His work was also featured in the landmark exhibition, Reconstructions: Architecture and Blackness in America, at the Museum of Modern Art.

Julie Canter is a licensed landscape architect with over 15 years of experience. She has worked as both a designer and project manager, leading complex projects within the United States and abroad. Julie's work spans both the public and private sector, often working within dense, urban environments.

To all of these projects, Julie brings strategic thinking, design vision, and knowledge of constructability, all which have led to the success implementation of projects and continued client relationships. Julie is both LEED and WEDG accredited, with a keen interest in creating designs that are sustainable and resilient for both people and the environment, while also maintaining a high quality of craft and design. Julie received a Bachelor of Science in Landscape Architecture, with a dual concentration in Ecology and Art and Architectural History, from Cornell University in 2003 and a Master of Landscape Architecture from the University of Pennsylvania in 2006.

Making Public Space for Inter-Species Connections

Nerea Feliz is associate professor at The University of Texas at Austin. Her research encompasses both scholarly and creative activities with a sustained focus on public space and an emphasis on inclusivity. Situated at the intersection of architecture, interior design, and interior urbanism, her work challenges disciplinary boundaries while investigating the role of design as a mediator between us, the public spaces we occupy, and pressing cultural and political questions. Her adoption of an expanded notion of inclusivity within public space, often extends to non-human species.

Nerea Feliz holds a Masters and Bachelor's degree in architecture from the Politecnica University of Madrid, Escuela Técnica Superior de Arquitectura (ETSAM).





Before joining UT, she taught for four years at the University at Buffalo's School of Architecture and Planning. Prior to moving to the US, Feliz worked for Foster & Partners (2004-06 & 2008-09) and Zaha Hadid Architects (2006-08) among others. As a registered architect in Spain and UK, she has worked on a wide range of project scales and programs: from mixed-use office buildings to a new terminal in Heathrow Airport and a temporary market in Spain. In 2010 she founded Nerea Feliz Studio, a creative research office. Since 2018, she often collaborates with Joyce Hwang under the name of Double Happiness.

Her projects and writing have been featured in publications including Architect Magazine, Ground Up, Platform, International Journal of Interior Architecture + Spatial Design, Interiors: Design/Architecture/Culture Journal, The Architect's Newspaper, and urbanNext. Her work has been exhibited nationally and internationally at a range of venues: The Bentway, Space P11, SXSW Eco, Matadero Madrid, and multiple academic institutions such as Toronto Metropolitan University and the Pontificia Universidad Catolica de Chile, among many others.



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
